MA/MS in Early Childhood: Inclusive Ed and Curriculum & Instruction (45 credits)

The four specializations include:

Constructivism in Early Childhood Education

The constructivism specialization is grounded in the works of Jean Piaget and Lev Vygotsky and influenced by the infant-toddler centers and preprimary schools of Reggio Emilia.

Early Childhood Special Education

The program is designed to provide the knowledge for you to support children, birth to age eight, with special needs and their families.

Infant Toddler Mental Health

This program is taught by an interdisciplinary team of faculty focusing on the most current research and interventions from the prenatal development to three years of age.

Distributed Pathway

This program allows you to select from a broad range of courses within the specialty areas. Students choose, with an advisor, two 3 credit courses from each of the three specializations.
