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

Challenge: A case-based video scenario that introduces the topic and invites inquiry

Wrap Up: A summary of the module content

Assessment: An opportunity for learners to evaluate what they have learned or need to study further

Case Studies

Activities

Information Briefs

Interviews

Evidence-Based Practice Summaries Tool

Search this tool for information about instructional and behavioral interventions, including the level of effectiveness and age groups for which those strategies and interventions are designed. Links to further information are also available for those who wish to learn more.

High-Leverage Practices (HLP) Tool

Developed in collaboration with CEEDAR, this tool identifies existing IRIS resources that contain information on HLPs, 22 essential special education techniques that all K–12 special education teachers should master for use across a variety of classroom circumstances. This tool allows users to sort results by:



- » HLP topic areas (assessment, collaboration, instruction, social/emotional/behavioral)
- » Degree of alignment (strongly, moderately, loosely)
- » Content type (information, implementation)

Fundamental Skill Sheets (FSS)
