

 Demonstrates what is involved in effective performance

SPACED LEARNING

Provides sustained
& repeated
opportunities to
practice
knowledge over a
period of time.

VARIED LEARNING

Provides
 opportunities to
 practice
 knowledge and
 skills across
 varying contexts,
 with a diverse
 range of student
 learners.

ESSENTIAL FEATURES OF DELIBERATE PRACTICE







COACHING AND FEEDBACK

 Provides explicit feedback on practice attempts

ANALYZING AND REFLECTING

 Engages in analysis and reflection of practice to deepen knowledge and expertise.

SCAFFOLDING

Provides
 opportunities
 to practice that
 gradually
 increase in
 complexity
 over time.

LESSON STUDY

 A practice-based approach that incorporates many of the features of effective practice
