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Who We Are



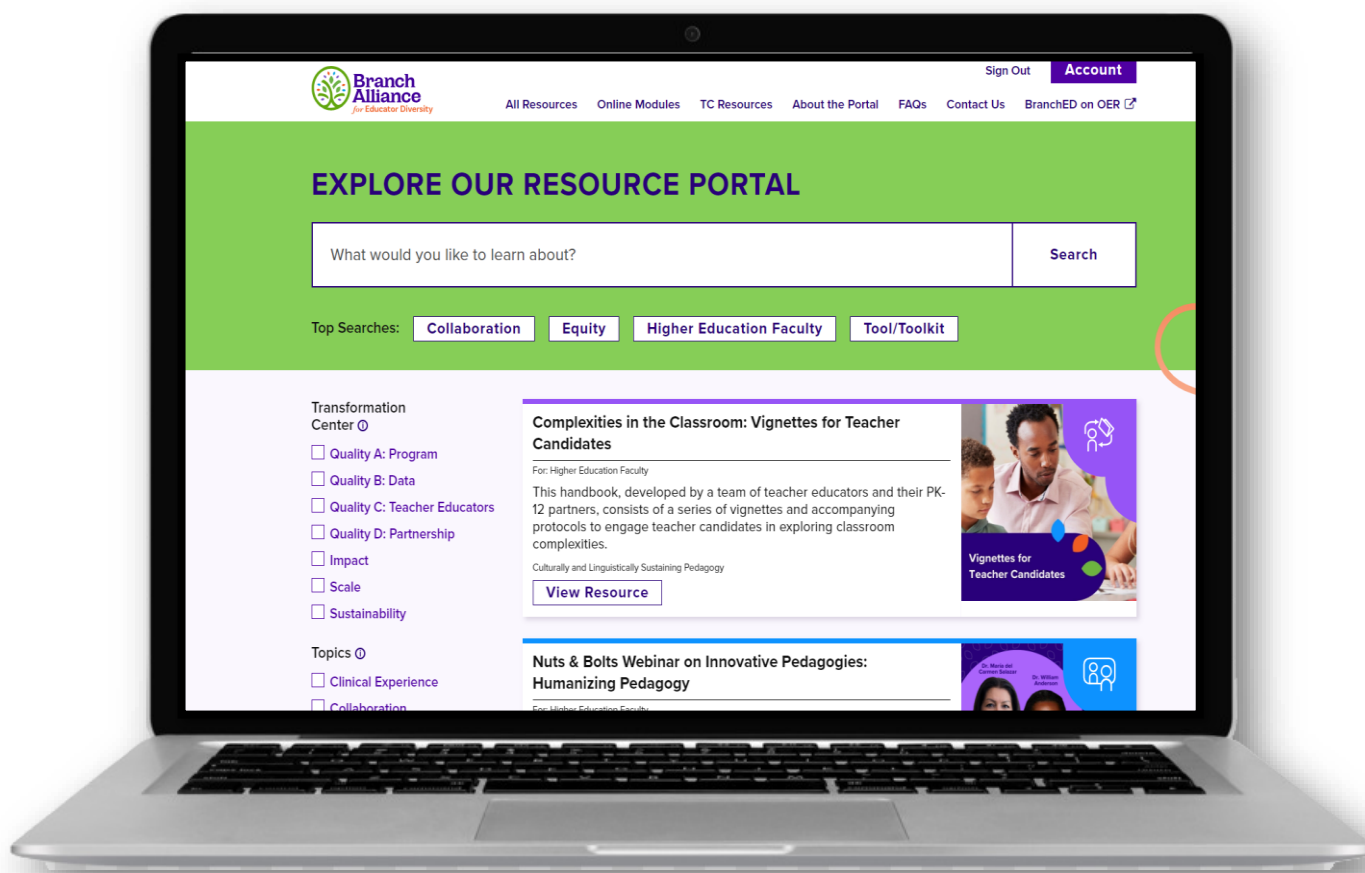

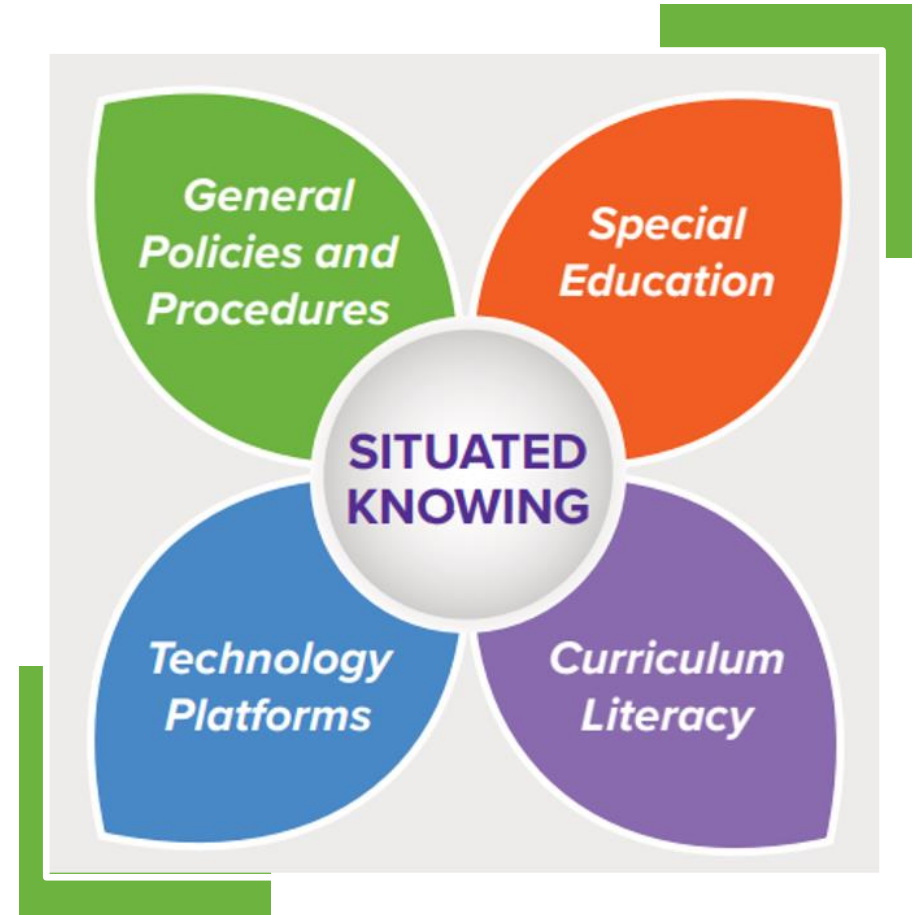


The Need

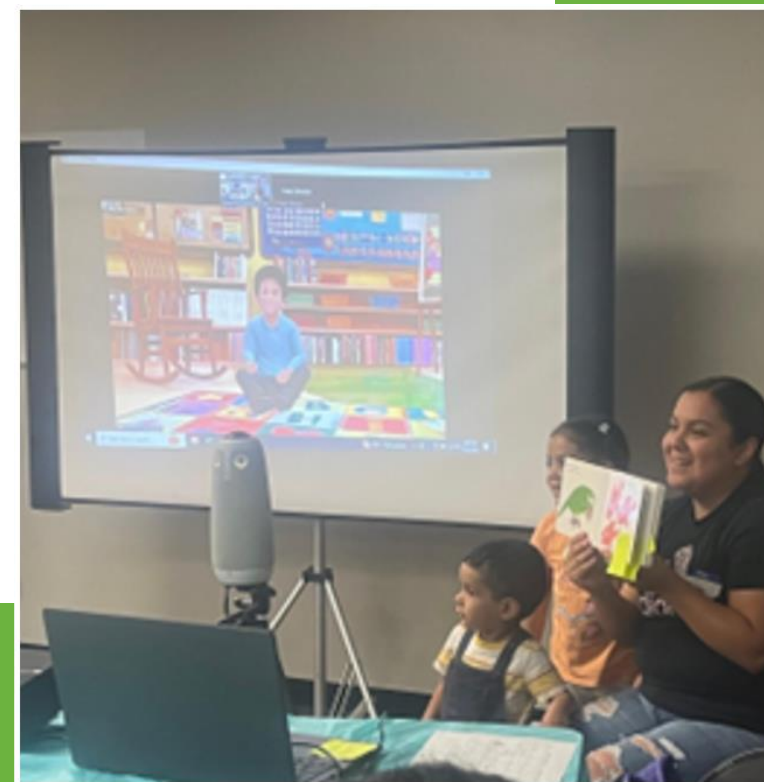

- Available in both English and Spanish to expand access and engagement





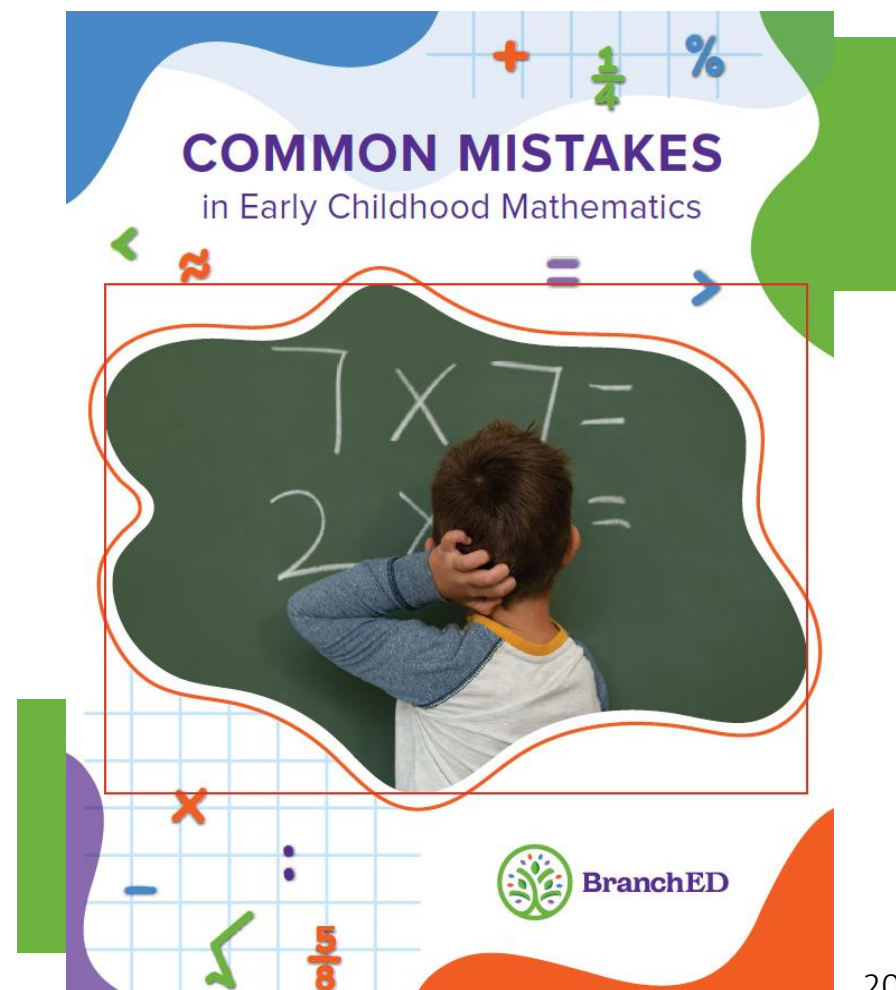
Common Mistakes

in Early Childhood Mathematics

- Emphasizes using mistakes as opportunities for deeper math learning
- Builds procedural fluency through strong conceptual understanding
- Supports parents, caregivers, and educators as “Math Guides” for young learners
- Promotes early math literacy through supportive, reflective practice

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HOW TO CREATE A PIVOTCHART USING MICROSOFT EXCEL

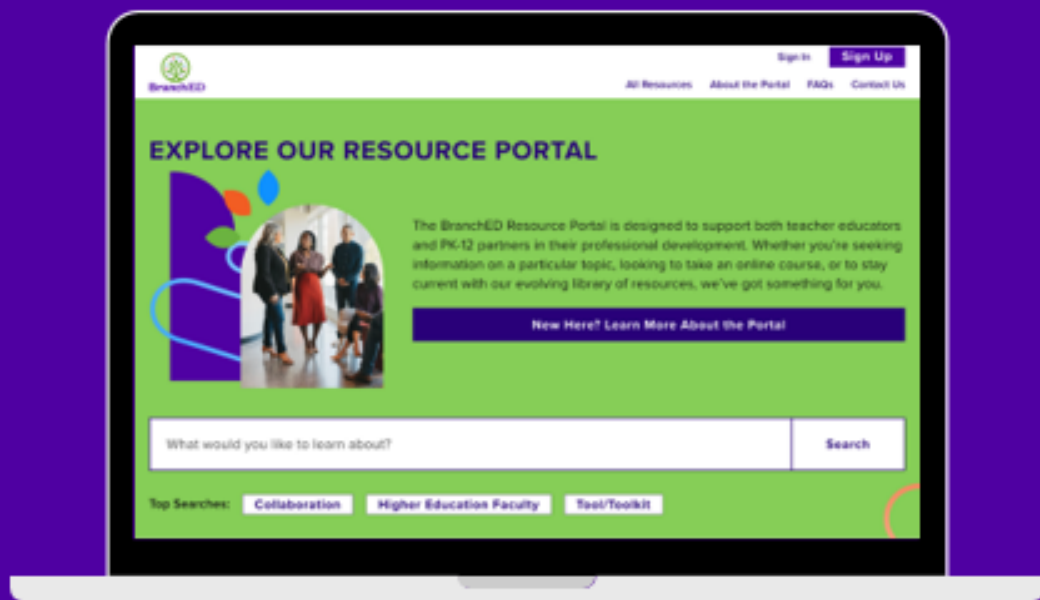
STEP 1: CREATE A PIVOT TABLE

1. Open dataset on Excel.
2. Highlight the dataset (see orange outline below). Makes sure to highlight all columns and rows pertaining to the data needing to be examined.
